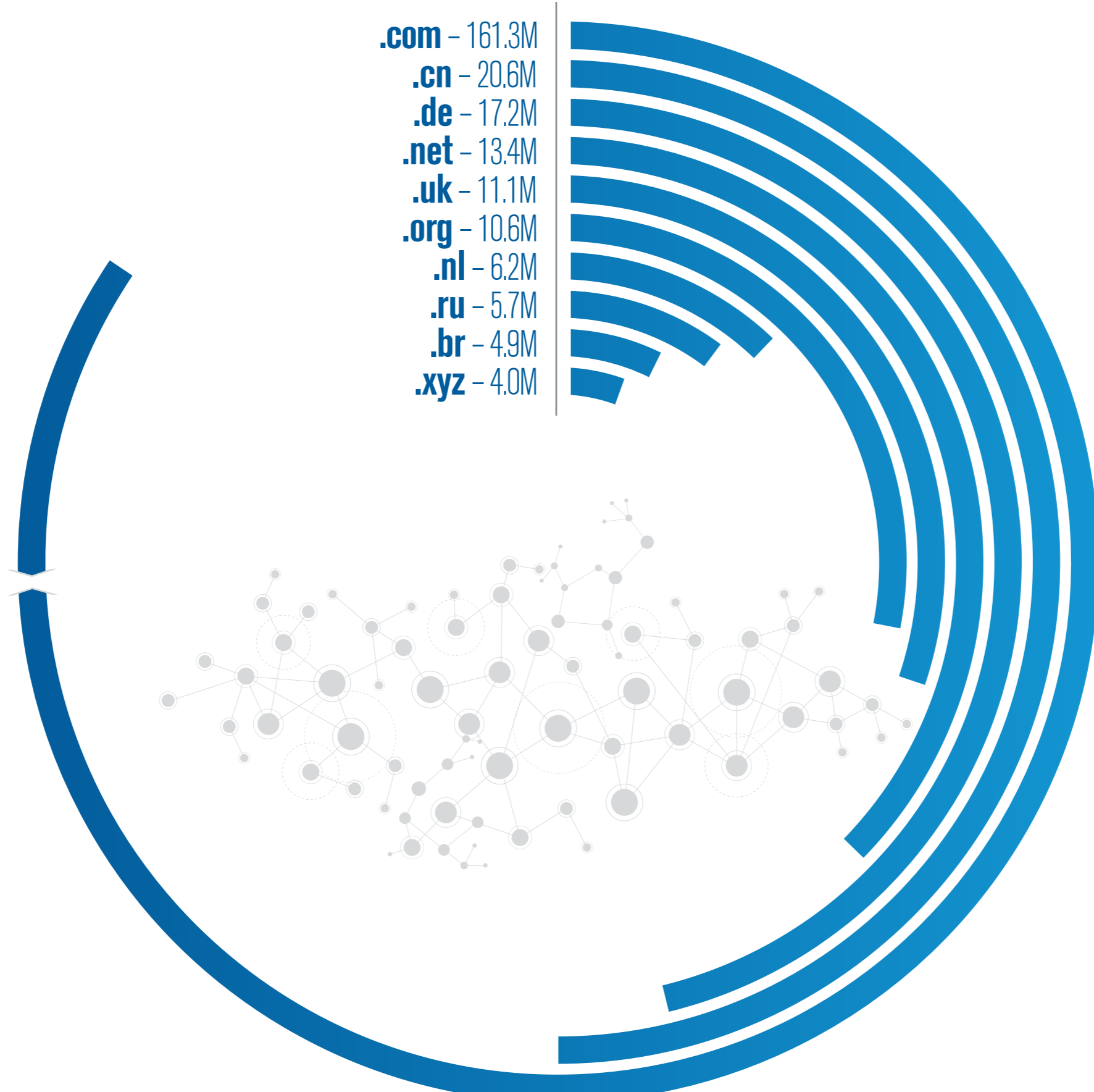

TOP 10 LARGEST TLDs BY NUMBER OF REPORTED DOMAIN NAMES^{1,2,3}

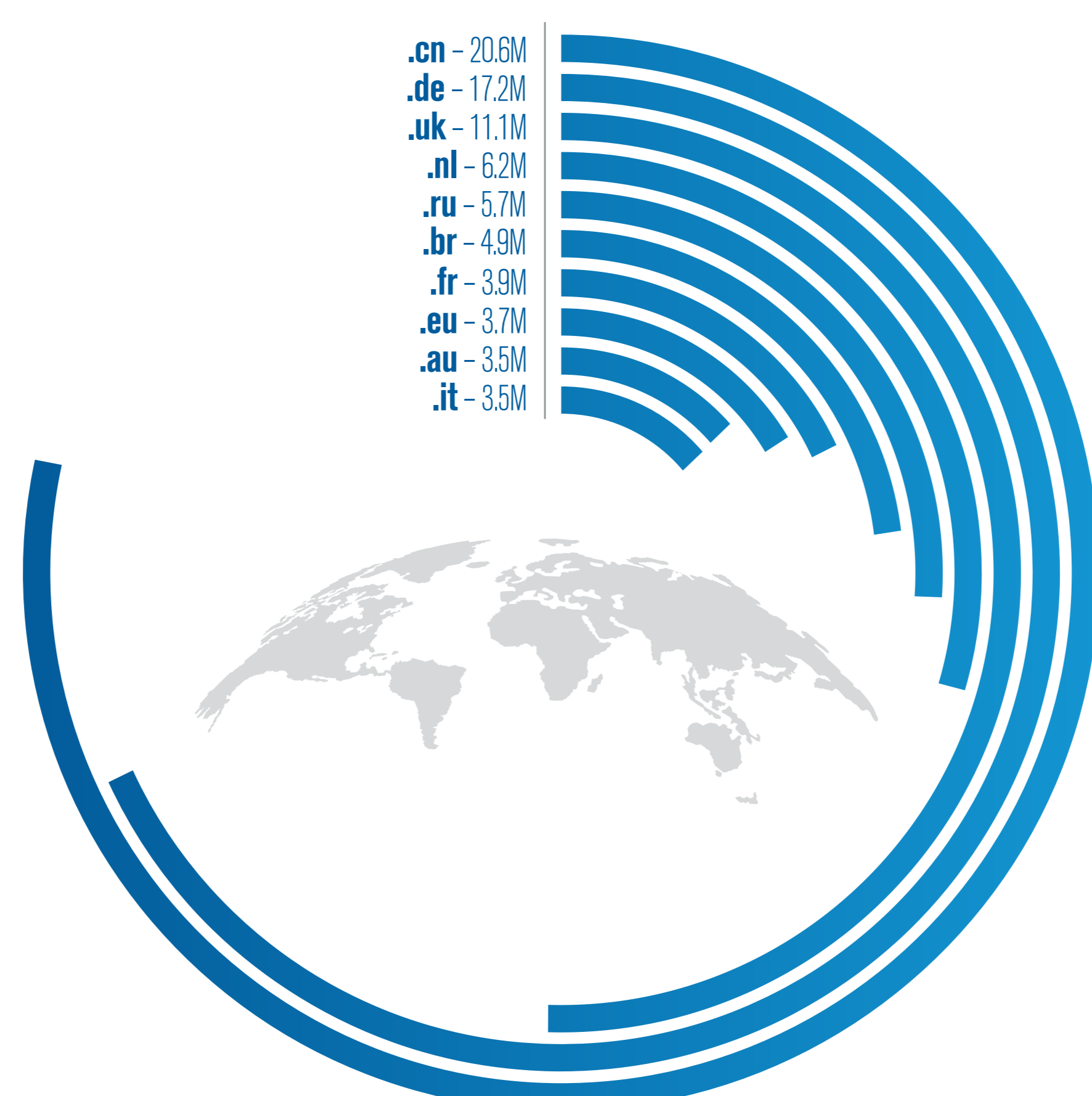
